Awards will be announced and presented towards the end of the conference.

- Among the student presenters in all five focus areas of the conference, one overall outstanding student will be selected for each oral and poster category. Each focus area is given equal importance in the selection process. The five focus areas of the conference are:
 - Degradation Mechanisms in Use Environments
 - Photovoltaics and Renewables
 - Pb-Free Electronics Reliability
 - Wide-Bandgap (WBG) Semiconductors
 - Emerging Microelectronics.
- The judges for the oral and poster awards are (a) Student Award Selection Committee, (b) Conference Attendees.
- Abstracts and full papers accepted will be submitted for inclusion into IEEE Xplore® (proceedings) as well as other Abstracting and Indexing (A&I) databases.
